

Nuclear disaster supplies

Minimum disaster kit

- 1 gallon of water per person per day for at least 3 days
- 3-day supply of non-perishable food
- an emergency radio (battery or hand-cranked)
- flashlight
- extra batteries for both
- dust masks to help filter contaminated air
- duct tape and plastic sheeting to shelter in place
- moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- local maps

According to FEMA; ideally, you should have a kit ready in all locations you frequent, including your vehicle.

Additional supplies

- radius maps of nuclear yields
- distance table of frequented locations to potential targets
- 2 weeks of water
- physical copy of nuclear survival manual
- CB40 masks or FFP2 masks
- Geiger counter
- personnel dosimeter
- hazmat suits (activated charcoal military surplus) or regular disposable overalls
- rubber boots
- disposable gloves
